


Figure 1: Daily Rainfall at Canefield and Melville-Hall

June normally marks the start of the 'rainy' season in Dominica. This June however was unusually dry. 69.3mm/ 2.73in of rainfall were recorded at the Canefield Airport which was about 43% of the normal June rainfall. This June was the 5<sup>th</sup> driest since record-keeping began in 1982 and the 2<sup>nd</sup> driest in the last 10 years. A tropical wave which affected the area on the 30<sup>th</sup> produced the maximum daily total of 32.2mm/ 1.27in which was almost half of the monthly total. 18 dry days was recorded with a dry spell of 11 consecutive days spanning the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> weeks.

59.5mm/ 2.34in of rainfall were recorded at the Melville Hall Airport. This was the 4<sup>th</sup> driest June on record since 1969. The monthly total was 31% of the normal June rainfall. The maximum daily total of 14.4mm was also recorded on the 30<sup>th</sup>. 19 dry days was recorded with a dry spell

of 7 consecutive days during the  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  weeks.

On rain-fed farms, there have been reports of 'browning' occurring on parsley and celery and a mature plantain crop had to be cut as the trees dried up. Minimum planting of vegetables was observed in the field during the first 3 weeks of June; however roots crops such as yams and potatoes were planted.

**CLIMATE SUMMARY FOR JULY** 

## **Canefield Airport:**

Normally, 254.9mm/ 10.04in of rainfall and about 21 rainfall days are recorded in July. The highest rainfall total recorded for the month was 393.3mm/ 15.48in in 2010 and the lowest was 45.1mm/ 1.78in 1994. Average daily temperature is 28.9°C while the average maximum is 32.9°C and the average minimum is 22.6°C.

## **Melville-Hall Airport:**

Normally, 237.2mm/ 9.34in of rainfall are recorded and about 22 rainfall days for the month of July. The highest rainfall total recorded for the month was 459.2mm/ 18.08in in 2011 and the lowest total was 57.2mm/ 2.25in in 1975. Average daily temperature is 28.6°C while the average maximum is 31.5°C and the average minimum is 22.6°C.




Figure 2 Precipitation outlook for the Caribbean: July-August-September 2012

- Models are indicating that during the period July-August-September, rainfall over Dominica is likely to be normal to below normal.
- There is a 30% chance that rainfall total

will be above normal, a 35% chance of being near normal and a 35% of being below normal.

 Air temperature at 2m is predicted to be slightly above normal.

## OUTLOOK FOR THE FARMING COMMUNITY

With normal to below normal rainfall for this period being suggested, banana and plantain farmers should be vigilant in the fields as normal conditions increase the incidence of pest and diseases such as *yellow sigatoka* and the recently discovered *black sigatoka*. Plants which show symptoms should be de-leafed. Additionally, contact the Division of Agriculture at extensions 3803/3820 or your extension officer for further information.

Rainwater should be harvested for irrigation during heavy rainfall events as the uneven distribution of rainfall may be more significant than the actual amount.

Farmers may sow vegetable seeds and plant root crops such as dasheen while land preparation practices such as tilling may be undertaken.

Livestock farmers should undertake pasture development while allowing ruminants to graze in the open thus reducing the use of imported feed. Remember to de-worm your animals!
