


National Agromet Advisory Bulletin

Thursday, 8th October, 2009 (For the period 8th to 12th October, 2009)



Rainfall Forecast valid upto 1430 hours IST of 11th October, 2009

- Many Places: West Bengal, Sikkim, Coastal Orissa, Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, Andaman & Nicobar Islands,
- Few Places: Bihar, Jharkhand, Interior Orissa.
- Isolated Places: Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Andhra Pradesh, Coastal Karnataka, Konkan & Goa, Chhattisgarh.
- Mainly dry Weather: Uttar Pradesh New Delhi, Haryana, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Interior Karnataka, Kerala, Lakshadweep, Madhya Maharashtra, Marathwada, Gujarat, Saurashtra & Kutch, Vidarbha and Madhya Pradesh.

Warning (for next 48 hours)

- Heavy to very heavy rainfall is likely at a few places over northeastern States during next 48 hours.
- Isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall is likely over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim during next 24 hours.

Withdrawal of Southwest Monsoon



Like last two years, this year also there was delay in the withdrawal of southwest monsoon due to rainfall activity over north India in associated with the mid latitude westerly activities. The withdrawal of SW Monsoon from west Rajasthan started only on 25th September (a delay of more than 3 weeks). The normal date of withdrawal to start from extreme western parts of Rajasthan is 1st September. Subsequently, it withdrew from most parts of the northwestern states and from the northern parts of Gujarat on 28th September.

Salient Advisories

- During last week severe flood situation was reported in Kurnool, Guntur, Cuddapah, Khammam, Guntur and Mehboobnagar districts in Andhra Pradesh, Bijapur, Bagalkot, Raichur, Bellary, Gulbarga, Koppal, Gadag, Bidar and Belgaum districts in Karnataka, Sindhudurg, Ratnagiri, Solapur, Kolhapur, Sangli and Ahmednagar districts in Maharashtra and crops like chilli, cotton, rice, maize, groundnut, jowar and tur have been damaged to great extent. Farmers are advised to arrange for drainage facilities and provide mechanical support to the lodged crops.
- As rain/thundershowers is likely at many places along with heavy rainfall over West Bengal, Sikkim, Coastal Orissa, Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, postpone irrigation, intercultural operations and application of fertilizers and pesticides to the standing crops. Provide adequate drainage facilities in Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim to avoid water logging due to heavy rainfall.
- Farmers are advised not to apply irrigation in Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat region, Maharashtra, Orissa and Kerala as there was sufficient rainfall in these States during last week.
- As there was no significant rain in Saurashtra & Kutch, Rajasthan, Bihar, Jharkhand, Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Chhattisgarh, Punjab, Haryana and Rajasthan during last week and no significant rain is likely to occur for next five days, farmers are advised to apply need based irrigation to the standing crops.

Advisories for rabi sowing

- Farmers are advised to undertake field preparation and sowing of rabi crops like sorghum, gram, cowpea and maize in Karnataka and redgram, rajmah, cowpea and niger in Andhra Pradesh after receding of water in flood affected areas.
- Prepare the land and undertake sowing of berseem and raya in Punjab and Haryana.
- As the weather is likely to favourable for sowing of rapeseed and mustard, undertake land preparation and sowing in Bihar, West Bengal and Interior Orissa.


Advisories for pest and disease


- As the weather is relatively warm and humid and most of the crops are in vegetative/flowering/grain formation stages, there are chances of pest and disease incidences in the following regions.
 - Brown plant hopper in rice in Delhi
 - Jassid in cotton in Haryana
 - Scale and mealy bug in sugarcane in Andhra Pradesh
- Farmers are advised to undertake plant protection measures, if required.


Contour maps for the week ending 07.10.09







The subdivisions like Arunachal Pradesh, Assam & Meghalaya, Bihar, Punjab, Jammu & Kashmir, West Rajasthan, Saurashtra & Kutch and Chattisgarh received scanty / deficient rain in 4 out of last 5 weeks; Andaman & Nicobar Islands, SH West Bengal & Sikkim, Jharkhand, Haryana, Chandigarh & Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, West Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Konkan & Goa, Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Lakshadweep received scanty / deficient rain in 3 out of last 5 weeks. Remaining States received normal / excess rain in 2 or more weeks during last 5 weeks.

- **Realised Rainfall:** The state received deficient/scanty rainfall during last week.

- **Rainfall Forecast**: Isolated rain/thundershowers likely over the State during next 24 hours and mainly dry weather thereafter.
- Major *Kharif* Crops: Rice, Vegetables
- Crop Stage: Maize(silking), vegetables(early vegetative), rice(panicle initiation/flowering)
- **Crop Condition**: Good.
- Advisory:
 - Maintain proper depth of standing water in rice.
- Major Seasonal Crop: Fruit crops, Flower crops and Vegetables
- Advisory:
 - As mainly dry weather is likely to prevail over the State, apply irrigation to the crops.
 - ➤ Prepare the field for sowing of early peas, leafy vegetables and raddish as the weather is favourable for sowing.
 - > It is optimum time for new plantation of tea plants or filling of gaps with new plants.
 - ➤ Complete field preparation and nursery raising of cabbage, cauliflower, knol khol, broccoli, parsley and lettuce. If the nursery of cabbage, cauliflower and broccoli is at 4-6 weeks stage can be planted in the fields directly.
 - > It is optimum time for raising the nursery of winter flowers like Calendula, arctotis, dog flowers, sweet pea, dianthus, petunia, stock and flox in fields.
 - ➤ Undertake weeding, intercultural operations and top dressing of fertilizers.
 - As weather is favourable for transplanting of lemon grass transplant it immediately if not done earlier.
 - > Undertake sowing of radish, turnip and carrot.
 - Farmers are advised to complete the sowing of all leafy vegetable like lettuce and palak.
- **Plant Protection**: Weather conditions are favourable for mild incidences of
 - > red spider mites in carnation, for control spray cypermethrin or nuvacron @0.05%.
 - ➤ leaf minor in new growth of citrus. For its control, spray 10 ml Matasystox or Malathion 10 ml in 10 litre of water.

Uttarakhand

- **Realised Rainfall:** The state received excess rainfall except Almora and Haridwar districts, which received deficient rainfall during last week.

- Rainfall Forecast: Isolated rain/thundershowers likely over the State during next 24 hours and mainly dry weather thereafter.
- Major Kharif Crops: Rice, Soyabean, Groundnut, Tur, mung, sesame.
- **Crop Stage:** Rice(grain formation/maturity stage), pulses(pod formation), oilseeds(vegetative/flowering)
- Crop Condition: Good
- Advisory:
- As there was good rainfall in most of the districts during last week, postpone irrigation to the standing crops. Provide proper drainage in all other standing crops where there was excess rainfall.
 - Maintain proper depth standing water in rice field. Harvest the early sown rice crop.
 - ➤ Major Seasonal Crop with stage: Sugarcane ratoon (early vegetative), cabbage, garlic, tomato (vegetative), French bean (early vegetative).
- Crop Condition: Good
- Advisory: Undertake weeding and intercultural operation.
 - Farmers are advised to continue sowing of recommended varieties of vegetable pea like VL Ageti Mater-7, Vivel Mater-10, Pant Subjee Mater-3, Azad Mater-3 and Arkel at high hills and ginger varieties like VL-Garlic or DARL-52.
 - Farmers in valley of 3000 ft may undertake planting of potato with optimum soil moisture. Select high yielding varieties like Kufri Jyoti, Kufri Ashok or Kufri Anand.
 - > Advisory for Plant Protection: Weather conditions are favourable for mild incidences of –
 - > sucking pests in Rajmah, spray a solution of 0.3 ml of 200 SL-Emidachloprid dissolved per litre of water.
- **Animal:** Give balanced feed to milking animals and clean properly their place of sitting in this rainy season.

- **Rainfall Forecast**: Mainly dry weather is likely to prevail over the State.
- Major Kharif Crops: Rice, maize, guar, til, urd, bajra, cowpea, cotton
- **Crop Stage:** Rice(flowering/grain formation), pulses(flowering/pod formation), cotton(flowering/fruiting), soybean(flowering/pod formation), maize(tasselling/silking), toria(early vegetative).
- **Crop Condition**: Rice crop is in satisfactory condition.
- Advisory:
- Undertake weeding, intercultural operations and application of fertilizers.
- As there was no significant rainfall during last week and mainly dry weather is likely in the State during next five days, apply irrigation to the standing crops.
- This is the optimum time for sowing of PDG 3 and PDG 4 varieties of gram under rainfed conditions and sowing of raya, autumn potato and African sarson wherever adequate soil moisture is available.
- In light textured soils sowing of taramira may be started.
- Major Seasonal Crop with stage: Sugarcane and Vegetables
- Advisory: Undertake weeding, intercultural operations in sugarcane and cotton.
 - This is suitable time for planting of evergreen fruit plants like sweet orange, mandarin, lime, lemon, guava and ber.
 - ➤ It is the time for planting of autumn sugarcane. Adopt 90 cm spacing between two rows of sugarcane and sow potato, toria, raya, cabbage and gram as intercrops.
 - > Sowing of fodder berseem may be completed in first week of October.
 - ➤ Advisory for Plant Protection: Weather conditions are favourable for mild incidences of –
 - > Jassid and white fly in cotton. Spray with recommended pesticides, if required.
 - > bacterial leaf blight of rice has appeared in the farmers field. Farmers are advised to regulate water in the fields to check its further spread.
- Animal Husbandry: Feeds to be protected from fungal contamination and wet feeds to be dried and fed. Milch animals tend to come in heat during this season. So animals should be checked in morning and evening for the heat.

- **Rainfall Forecast**: Mainly dry weather is likely over the State.

Farmers are advised to enter into the middle of the crop field and see mosquito like insect at the basal portion of the plant.  - Continue sowing of *rabi* jowar and safflower in Vidarbha, Marathwada & Madhya Maharashtra.
- Major Seasonal Crop: Fruit crops, Sugarcane and vegetables
 - Apply top dressing of N @160 kg/ha to new adsali sugarcane after 6-8 weeks of planting.
 - ➤ Undertake spraying, fertilizer application in the standing crops.
- **Plant Protection**: Weather conditions are favourable for mild incidences of
 - blue beetle and leaf folder & blast in *kharif* paddy in Konkan. For control of blue beetle and leaf folding caterpillar, spray Carbaril powder @ 2gm / lit of water with 1 ml sticker and for control of

- blast disease in transplanted rice field, spraying of Carbendazim @ 1gm / liter or copper-oxy-chloride @ 2.5gm/liter of water with 1 ml. sticker may be done.
- > Sap sucking pest on cotton in Central Vidarbha zone, for control spray Acitameprid 20 % WS@ 4 gm or Dimethoate 30 % WS @ 10 ml in 10 liters of water.

- ➤ Undertake intercultural operation and application of fertilizer and plant protection measures. Undertake planting of different fruit crops like mango, sapota, pomegranate, lemon, guava, custard apple etc.
- > Farmers are advised for sowing of fodder sorghum.
- > Undertake top dressing in castor.
- \triangleright Continue sowing of clusterbean varieties like GC 1, 2 at 30 cm spacing.
- **Plant Protection**: Weather conditions are favourable for mild incidences of
 - \blacktriangleright seedling rot in vegetable nursery, drench nursery with Bordeaux mixture@ 0.6% or Ridomil MZ@0.05% .
 - > collar rot and root rot diseases are observed in cotton and groundnut. Spray carbandezim @10 gm + mencozeb @ 20 gm in 10 liters of water.

- Advisory: Farmers are advised to transplant cabbage and cauliflower on the field.
 - Farmers are advised to undertake transplanting of chilli, tomato and onion.
 - ➤ Undertake pit preparation for planting of new orchard crops.
 - Farmers are advised to apply FYM/vermin compost, N, P, K at recommended dose for fruit crops
 - ➤ Undertake intercultural operations in the seasonal crop.
 - > Undertake sowing of gram, potato and pea.

• Plant Protection:

- > Weather conditions are favourable for-
 - > semi-looper in kharif crops; spray Trizophos 40 E.C. @ 2.0 ml/l for control.
 - > sucking pest i.e. jassid, white fly etc. in kharif crops; spray Amydachloroprid 17.8 SL. @ 0.5 ml/l for control.
 - ➤ White fly on vegetables like chilli, brinjal and tomato, spray Rogar or Dimethoete 1 ml per litre or Metasistox 1 ml per litre or Ethophenprox 10 EC per lire per hectare in 2 ml of water.
 - boll worm cotton crops, spray Profenophos 40% EC @ 3.0 ml/l.
 - ➤ girdle beetle/leaf defoliator in soyabean, spray Quinolphos 25 or Endosulphan 35 @ 1000 ml in 500 litre of water per hectare.
 - Mealy bug on cotton, spray 2ml Prophenophos or 2 ml Quinolphos per litre of water.
 - > pod borer in pigeonpea, spray Profenophos 50 EC may be sprayed @ 1.5 l/ha.
- **Animal Husbandry:** To control ticks and mite in cattle, sheep and goat, apply butox / deltox @ 4 ml / litre of water on the body in Jhabua and Dhar districts.
- Arrange vaccination for animals to protect from the disease Galghotu, Langadi and Anthrex in Sagar, Bhopal, Vidisha, Damoh, Raisen, Sehore.
- Farmers should vaccinate there animals for Khurpaka-Muhpaka disease in Jhabua and Dhar.

 - Farmers are advised to undertake intercultural operations, application of fertilizers and pesticides in early sown crops.
 - ➤ Undertake sowing of linseed, toria, early potato and early pea, gram.
- Plant protection: Weather conditions are favourable for the incidences of
 - leaf folder in arhar, farmers are advised to spray chlorpyriphos @ 2 ml/litre of water.
 - Diamond Back Month. spray carup hydrochloride or Fipronil.
 - > Yellow vein mosaic in Okra, spray confidor.
 - Attack of cashew, stem and root borer, spray Metarhizium anicopli (fungicide) should be used @ 250 gms. + FYM @ 0.5 kg./ tree.
